Article from Anne Hamilton's Sedalia BPW
scrap book dating back to 1927. Below is an
excerpt of the article published in the Sedalia
Capital dated June 3, 1927.

THIRTY-TWO MEMBERS MOTORED TO SMITHTON AND ENJOYED CHICKEN DINNER LAST NIGHT

Thirty-two members of the Sedalia Business
and Professional Women's club motored to
Smithton last night where they enjoyed a
delicious chicken dinner served by Mrs. W. B.
Meyers at the Meyers Cafe.

Prior to the serving of the dinner Miss
Cathrine Urban, formerly a member of the club,
now attending state university, was called upon
by Mrs. N. L. Nelson, the club's president, to ask
the invocation. Miss Elizabeth Titsworth of
Colorado was introduced as a guest, as was Dr. J.
E. Cannaday, president of the Chamber of

Commerce, who had been asked to address the members.

Dr. Cannaday made a most interesting talk, tell of problems faced in the business world. He spoke especially of salesmanship, how a sale was something that satisfied the purchaser, made a fair profit for the employer, and in which the salesperson learned something. He told of the value of studying the patrons and customers, how to handle talkative customer, the silent customer, the confident customer and the suspicious one, and stated that the women employed, who really was courteous to those with whom she came in contact and gave real service to the company would advance. Likewise, he said, no company will bear with the woman or man, in business, who does not give service.

Dr. Cannaday then told of the value of an idea carried out, how the real successes in the world were due, not to capital, or to labor, but to the person with an idea. He also told the women of the advantages open to women in the business world today, and as an illustration mentioned Captain Lindbergh's flight to Paris, in which he did not turn back when he encountered sleet but went on and won success, as the women can to if they will only use the determination that Lindbergh did.

Reports of the various committees were given, Miss Christine Hutchinson, treasurer; Miss Susan Hurlbut, entertainment committee; Miss Anna Marie Moresman, little sister committee.

The club voted to contribute to the fund toward paying the expenses of Hugo Swann, who will conduct a two-day institute for the merchants in the city on June 13 and 14.
