MEMBER NOTES

Article from Anne Hamilton's Sedalia BPW scrap book dating back to 1927. Below is an excerpt of the article published in the Sedalia Capital dated September 5, 1927.

Banquet, Also A Fall Rally for Women's Club:
Out of Town Guests Entertained Thursday
Night:

The club was very happy to have with them on this occasion a member of the Palm Beach, Fla., business women's club, a charming woman of eighty-eight years of age, Mrs. Lucy Rapp, who was the guest of Miss Bessie Brinton. Mrs. Rapp is at the present time the guest of Sedalia relatives.

Another guest on this occasion, who is always a welcome visitor in Sedalia, was Miss Winifred Weatherman, now of Warrensburg, who was chairman of the Missouri Delegation attending the National convention in Oakland, Calif., this summer. Miss Weatherman, in a most interesting way, told of the trip to California on the president's special, which started from New York. On the train was Miss Lena Madisen Phillips, the national president,

and the national officers. On its arrival in Kansas City the train contained only one section, with nine cars, but by the time it reached Oakland there were three sections, carrying 678 women going to the convention. She told of the comforts on the train, of the bulletin boards, of a daily newspaper published enroute, and of the wonderful manner in which the delegates were entertained in the cities visited enroute.

She spoke of the gifts presented the national officers by the various states, while Missouri's gift to those on the train was not in the form of a special gift to the national officers, but a small book, called "The Log" which contained the names of all those on the train, the town and city from which they came, and their occupation. She also told of Missouri's stunt at the convention, which was a Lindbergh stunt, symbolizing the Spirit of Missouri.

Handbills advertising Missouri's stunt were distributed at the convention, which read: "Missouri Business and Professional Women's club have come to you on a Good Will Flight. Our plane symbolizes the Business and Professional Women's Club all over the United States. It is equipped with non-political wings, non-sectarian rudder, self-supporting fuel, self-governing motor and with over 47,000 women power. Our plane is navigated by Lena Madesin Phillips towards better business women for a better business world.

Take off is - to elevate the standard for women in business and professions.

Altitude is - to promote the interests of business and professional women and to bring a spirit of cooperation among them.

Motor speed - to stimulate local, state and national organization.

Wing speed - to extend opportunities to business and professional women through education along lines of industrial, scientific and vocational activities.

Plane Assembling - Conventions which create fellowship and friendship among its members."
