MANY SPECIAL EVENTS FOR THE B. AND P. W. CLUB

The members of the Sedalia Business and
Professional Women's Club enjoyed a dinner
Thursday evening, served by the members of the
Ladies' Auxiliary to the American Legion, in the
American Legion hall.

During the dinner Miss Ernestine Urban, an
"expert" on the ukulele, gave a number of musical
numbers, and accompanied the members during the
singing of many club songs.

Another enjoyable feature of the meeting was
three violin solos by Miss Marian Smith, one of the
city's talented young ladies. She was accompanied by
her mother Mrs. C. L. Patterson.

Then followed the business session, presided over
by Mrs. N. L. Nelson. One new member, Miss Ella
Peithman was introduced, and it was announced that
Mrs. Albert N. Tracey and Miss Frieda Weigland had
been taken into the club.

Miss Susan Hurlbut, chairman of the
entertainment committee reported on the future
plans for the club, of the picnic with Marshall next
week when the latter club will receive its charter, of
